### **Finance Committee**

A meeting of the Finance Committee was called to order by Chairman DiNatale on Tuesday, May 25, 2021 at 6:00 PM in the Legislative Building, 700 Main Street, Fitchburg, MA.

Committee Members present: Councilors Marcus DiNatale, Thomas Hughes, Elizabeth Walsh, and Anthony Zarrella. Councilor Paul Beauchemin arrived late.

Committee Members absent: None.

The chairman read an announcement regarding the recording of public meetings, noting that FATV was recording and broadcasting the meeting. No other person stated that they were recording the meeting.

The chairman opened the meeting for public comment. No one had registered to speak.

Discussion: City Clerk Mary de Alderete was present. The chairman read a letter from Ms. de Alderete dated May 4, 2021.

Action: Motion to approve made by Councilor Zarrella and second by Councilor Hughes. Motion adopted. (4-0)

ORDER: that there be and hereby is transferred from within the sum of FORTY THOUSAND AND 00/100 DOLLARS (\$40,000.00) same to be charged against RESERVE FOR OTHER MUNICIPAL PURPOSES, CAPITAL EXPENSES and credited to LIBRARY CAPITAL, BUILDING RENOVATION for engineering to design new heating and cooling systems.

Discussion: Chief Librarian Sharon Bernard and Facilities Director Russell Karlstad were present.

The chairman read a letter from Ms. Bernard and Mr. Karlstad dated May 8, 2021.

Action: Motion to approve made by Councilor Hughes and second by Councilor Walsh.

Motion adopted. (4-0)

Councilor Beauchemin joined the meeting.

ORDER: that there be and hereby is transferred from within the sum of SIX HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND AND 00/100 DOLLARS (\$625,000.00) same to be charged against RESERVE FOR OTHER MUNICIPAL PURPOSES, CAPITAL EXPENSES and credited to SOUTH STREET SCHOOL ROOF & BOILERS CAPITAL PROJECT.

Discussion: City Treasurer Anne Cervantes and City Auditor Calvin Brooks were present. The chairman read a letter from Ms. Cervantes and Mr. Brooks dated May 11, 2021. Ms. Cervantes stated that the idea behind this order is to save money on future interest costs. Councilors asked how much the savings could be and Ms. Cervantes replied that the cost for temporary borrowing this year for this loan was about \$12,000.

Action: Motion to approve made by Councilor Zarrella and second by Councilor Walsh. Motion adopted. (5-0)

094-21 LOAN ORDER: appropriate FOUR MILLION DOLLARS (\$4,000,000.00) to pay costs of various Wastewater Infrastructure Projects as outlined in the enclosed Loan Order.

Discussion: Wastewater Deputy Commissioner Jeff Murawski was present. The chairman read a letter from Mr. Murawski dated May 12, 2021. Councilors asked how much more rate payers will have to pay and for how long in order to comply with the consent decree requirements. Mr. Murawski replied that this project is probably the largest one left with an estimated \$21 million construction cost. There are then three more projects to complete before 2030. Although an upgrade to the tertiary treatment system is part of the decree, the city is petitioning the EPA to defer this project, since there will be a greater gain by pursuing these combined sewer separation projects. He estimated that the cost of completing all future projects required by EPA will be in the ballpark of \$100 million.

Councilors noted that the federal government are the ones pushing this compliance and who think that the ratepayers can afford it.

Action: Motion to approve made by Councilor Beauchemin and second by Councilor Zarrella. Motion adopted. (5-0)

Motion to adjourn made by Councilor Beauchemin second by Councilor Zarrella. Motion adopted. (5-0)

The meeting adjourned at 6:11 PM.

I am requesting a loan appropriation of \$4,000,000 for the mandated environmental project detailed below. The project is required by the 2012 executed Consent Decree (CD) between the City and the United States Department of Justice (DOJ).

### WATER.

1200 Rindge Road 978-345-9616 978-345-9555 FAX We will seek funding through the State Revolving Fund ('SRF'), which provides 2% financing to upgrade or replace wastewater infrastructure, on the project's pre-design "SSES Investigations" services. Designer services are not SRF eligible, and will be bonded separately within the same (\$4M) borrowing authorization appropriation.

The loans will be charged to the Wastewater Enterprise Fund. In order to cover the cost of the borrowing, rates were adjusted (passed by City Council in April 2018, for FYs 2019 - 2023) which will be sufficient to fund the subject borrowing authorization.

301 Broad Street 978-829-1917 978-345-9687 FAX The current request for \$4,000,000, in addition to past loan orders, is for the next phase of projects that are mandated by the CD and include: Sewer System Evaluation Survey ('SSES') investigations costs and designer engineering services costs of the CSO 010, 032, 045, 083 Separation/Rehabilitation Project (also referred to as the "Main Street Area Combined Sewer Separation Project").

### **CEMETERIES**

115 Mount Elam Road 978-345-9578 978-345-9686 FAX The City has historically required the Wastewater Enterprise and the sewer rate payers to fund the removal of streets runoff stormwater and sources of ground water from the sewer system and the Publicly Owned Treatment Works. This City practice is anticipated to continue into the foreseeable future, and is incorporated into the subject project's designer engineering services budget cost.

This sewer separation project is the first of the remaining sewer separation projects that will fully separate the City's combined sewers into separate sanitary and separate storm drain systems. The anticipated project area (see attached GIS figure, prepared by Fitchburg DPW -Wastewater Division) is primarily area north of western Main Street, including Prospect Street and Mechanic Street arterial streets, as far north as former Burbank Hospital and Bigelow Road/western Blossom Street, and as far east as Mt. Vernon Street.

This project will permanently close four (4) very active Combined Sewer Overflow regulators that have historically released high amounts of untreated wastewater and stormwater to the environment during rain events, thereby greatly improving the quality of the North Nashua River and also greatly reducing extraneous infiltration and inflow (non-sewage water) from reaching our Easterly Wastewater Treatment Plant, helping the City progress towards final compliance with the Consent Decree.

Also attached to this letter request, is the suggested loan order language to be provided to the City's Bond Counsel.
