The Fitchburg Public Library renovation celebrated with a groundbreaking ceremony on Tuesday to mark the start of work on the project, beginning with “abatement and demolition work” prior to renovation and construction work. The project encompasses the renovation of the existing Wallace Library, which was first built in 1967, and the creation of an entirely new children’s space and community learning center, which will include a new community room, conference spaces and meeting rooms, a learning computer lab, and a Makerspace, among many other improvements.
