Downtown Fitchburg proudly welcomed Governor Healey, Lt. Governor Driscoll, Congresswoman Trahan, and Secretary Augustus to announce over \$1.4 million in HDIP awards in April—with Fitchburg front and center 🏙️. This round supports 24 new apartments at 329 and 633 Main Street, transforming long-vacant buildings into much-needed housing and vibrant storefronts. We gathered at 347-355 Main, the future home of Power Surge Bar Arcade and 8 new units, funded in a previous round and opening this summer 🎮.

HDIP is a game-changer for cities like ours—bridging funding gaps, revitalizing upper-story spaces, and supporting local contractors—all at a fraction of the cost of traditional affordable housing.
