
The Co-Op Mall already features 12 local vendors and is open Thursday through Sunday, 10 AM to 5 PM.

Why You're Seeing So Much Water Line Work Around Fitchburg... We have a lot of water main replacement projects happening across the city:

Fitchburg's water system is old and massive: 187 miles of water main, 11,000 service connections, and about 1,800 hydrants. Some of these pipes are more than a century old....we're replacing pipes laid back when horse-drawn wagons shared the road with cars!

Because of the age and materials making up our pipes, the city loses up to 25% of its water each year... that's not one big mystery leak but thousands of small ones, plus unmetered uses like hydrant flushing, fire dept. training, and other unmetered uses. In an ideal system, we'd lose less than 10% of our water. With Fitchburg's age and topography, our realistic goal is to get closer to 15%.... and every project you see in the ground is a step toward that.

To stay ahead, our crews and contractors use modern leak detection systems citywide every few years, plus in-house searches year-round. Each water main replacement costs about \$2.6 million per mile. Right now, 60-80 miles of main need replacement... that's roughly \$160 million in work, with no outside funding and only a \$9 million annual budget with about 33% of that going to capital projects and debt service for capital projects.

We're doing this work now because the longer we wait, the more costly and disruptive it becomes. These replacements help us:

- Reduce water loss and pressure fluctuations
- Improve water quality and reliability
- Prevent emergency shutdowns and costly breaks like 3 a.m. emergency digs in the snow & ice
- Protect the system for future generations

We are investing in the unseen infrastructure below our streets to keep everything above them running smoothly. Every time we dig, replace, and reseal a line, we're ensuring safe, reliable water for the next generation.

Fitchburg 2025 Paving Recap: We're wrapping up another strong construction season with over 7.2 miles of Fitchburg roads newly paved in 2025: that's more than 37,000 feet of smoother, safer streets across our city. Thanks to the dedicated crews from Fitchburg DPW, Engineering, Highway, and our contractors who worked long hours and early mornings to get it done.

These improvements are part of our ongoing commitment to rebuild and maintain Fitchburg's road network. This winter we will be working with our new Pavement Management Plan Engineers at BETA to continue improving our roadways through preservation strategies -- keeping the good roads good and repaving the worst--- tracking progress year over year to get the most impact out of every dollar invested.

Monument Park update... the benches are back!

After being removed around 2016, benches are being reinstalled at Monument Park to match the historic character (& comfort) of the space. Working with the Historical Commission, we're using the black painted cast-metal "Boston Bench" style with center armrest dividers, the same look used at the Upper Common. In several corners you'll see paired benches set at 90 degrees, just like earlier layouts in the park's history.

Thank you to Parks Commission member Dave Brooks and his company that have offered Monument Park as their "adopt a park," DPW and Parks crews handling placement and prep, and the Historical Commission for helping us keep every detail consistent with the Monument Park Local Historic District guidelines.

What's next at Monument Park:

- Shade trees, added carefully at corners near bench areas, using sturdy species that hold up in ice storms
- Planning to dry-reset the Main Street granite steps on a stable, well-draining base
- A phased plan to repair the cast-iron perimeter fence, including locating or fabricating replacement balusters

Proud of Team Fitchburg at Public Health Excellence Day at the State House

Victoria Selser, our Epidemiologist for the MPHNN and the City of Fitchburg Health Department and myself were invited as keynote speakers to share how our Health Department delivers real results for families and why public health funding matters. We were joined by Commissioner of the Mass. Department of Public Health Dr. Robbie Goldstein and Director of Public Health for Foxborough Matthew Brennan.

As Mayor of Fitchburg, I know firsthand how a strong public health organization impacts the quality of life in our city. They protect our families, support our students, and strengthen our local economy.

Our Health Department is one of the most frequently contacted departments by my office, because it's one of the departments that touches the lives of our residents the most. Our Public Health personnel are the first responders of everyday life ... showing up in everyday efforts... protecting tenants' rights to a safe home, helping residents dispose of waste responsibly, and making our city cleaner and safer for everyone.

Fitchburg is proud to lead the Montachusett Public Health Network, a Shared Service Arrangement of 13 cities and towns across northern Worcester County serving nearly 180,000 residents. The City of Fitchburg Health Department serves as both the lead and fiscal agent for the Network, coordinating regional staffing, finances, and programming.

This collaboration is supported by the Public Health Excellence grant program, which awarded the Montachusett Public Health Network \$555k for FY26. Through this support, our region continues to build a stronger, more coordinated system of public health services.

Through this regional collaboration we are able to pool staff, resources, and expertise, ensuring that every municipality, large and small, can meet the same high standards of health protection. Together, we provide communicable disease investigation, nursing support, vaccination clinics & homebound vaccination support, and soon to provide lactation support for new mothers. This collective approach creates efficiency, ensures equity, and builds community resilience.

Regionalization works because health challenges don't stop at our powerful yet invisible city line. Disease, addiction, environmental hazards, and inequities cross all boundaries. So, our response must too. Strong public health leads to strong cities and strong cities leads to strong regions.

Here is what Fitchburg leads and delivers:

We lead the Montachusett Public Health Network... 13 cities and towns, serving about 180,000 residents, supported by a FY26 \$555,000 Public Health Excellence grant.

PHE funding lets us staff up with specialists like an epidemiologist and community health workers, so services are data-driven and accessible across the region.

School vaccines: one school moved from 45% fully immunized to over 95% after outreach and access efforts.

We launched the North Central Free Medical Program in Fitchburg... Massachusetts' first free clinic operated by a local health department... connecting residents to physicals, vaccines, and basic care.

Lead prevention: This past year 75 children received services with elevated lead levels to prevent lead-poisoning, and zero progressed to lead poisoning.

Added impact: our team leveraged PHE capacity to bring in an extra \$450,000 in grants for the region.

Day to day, our Health Department also delivers communicable disease response, vaccination clinics including homebound support, soon to provide lactation (breastfeeding) support, and public health education.

Huge thanks to our Fitchburg Health Department, our MPHNN partners, and everyone championing local public health. Let's keep being a positive role model for how we can work together to build a healthier, safer city for our people.
